Animals at large create public safety issues that include attacks on humans and other animals; potential fatalities when dealing with canine pack behavior; a threat to their own well-being if injured, sick, or in a dangerous location; and the threat of communicable diseases which includes rabies and other vector related zoonoses. Chemical capture is used as a last resort and technical training is crucial for employee safety; animal safety; as well as public safety and concern.

# COURSE DESCRIPTION

Chemical Immobilization offers an alternative to the use of lethal force in response to animals that represent a danger to the public. This course will certify officers to chemically immobilize commonly-encountered animals, such as dogs, wildlife, exotics and agriculture animals.

Humane techniques and methods, drugs and delivery devices, and deployment protocol (what qualifies an animal for chemical immobilization) will be discussed. This course includes both classroom and practical training.

This is an 8-hour course. 10-minute breaks each hour, 1-hour lunch break.

Manuals will be provided to each student. Students should bring a pen, paper for note taking and a basic calculator to calibrate dosages. All participants are required to sign an insurance waiver in addition to providing a personal contact information sheet.

Participants will be required to attend the full training to receive the Certificate of Completion.
