If you have any problems, we suggest pre-baiting the trap for a day or two. Tie the door of the trap open, put a little bait at the front of the trap leading the animal into the trap. Put most of the bait behind the trip pan.

After the animal is familiar with the trap, then bait and untie the door. You are ready for the catch. Once the animal is trapped, the use of heavy gloves is recommended to pick up the trap and capture the animal.

For a fee of \$35, an Animal Control Officer will pick up the captured or trapped wildlife during daylight hours at your residence. Call (402)441-7900 and indicate that you are a county resident requesting wildlife pick up.

Suggested Baits

Cat: Cat food (canned and fish are best)
Dog: Dog food (canned) or meat bones
Opossum: Cat food (canned)
Raccoon: Fish (canned cat food) or corn
Skunk: Fish (canned cat food) or chicken entrails
Squirrel: Nuts, peanut butter, bread

Whenever a trap is not returned, a new one must be obtained at an additional cost to the taxpayers. If you fail to return the trap, we have no choice but to bill you for the cost, minus any deposit which will be forfeited. The cost of the traps are as follows:

Raccoon:	\$64.39
Skunk:	\$45.09
Cat:	\$45.09
Squirrel	\$27.45
